Brother Rice Builds for the Future

Maintaining educational excellence is the bottom-line in the proposed build-ing program for Brother Rice High School. The existing high school, which has served the needs of the students, teachers, and administrative staff successfully for almost 30 years, is showing signs of age. The outdated library, advances in technology, and the need for more classroom space mandate immediate improvements of the physical plant. The ultimate goal in the upcoming building program is to maintain the high educational standards and goals set by the Christian Brothers for the Brother Rice Educational Community.


TMP Associates began to work with the faculty, staff, administration and students of Brother Rice in 1984 to establish goals and priorities for the future of the campus.

An entire Master Plan concept was developed, of which Phase I is currently ready for implementation. Phase I includes the

addition of a Learning Resource Center (Library), eleven (11) new classrooms, and the remodeling of the administrative area.

The new addition will "wrap" around the south and west edges of the present building, creating a fresh architectural appearance to the total complex. The new structure will be one level, and its placement on the western (front yard) side of the site will assure the continued prominence of the existing Chapel.

Construction will begin in March of 1988. TMP has prepared contract documents. Bids are now being accepted. A construction management team or general contractor will be selected in December. You can make a contribution to the building fund by sending the enclosed form to the Development Office.



Fall Sports Update



Brother Rice has captured the State Golf Championship two years in a row and five times in the school's history. Congratulations to the Class of '88 "pros" Dave Brown, Jason Chaldecott, Anthony Dietz, Wally Knysz, Joseph McCarthy, Rob Morad. and, of course, Coach Jim Rademacher!

We asked Rob Morad what his thoughts were going into the state champion—ship: "Being a senior, I did not want to end my high school career on a bad note. The pressure built up as the day went on; however, the feeling I experienced after the tournament was indescribable! I was so relieved to win because a lot of people thought we would win. I'm glad we didn't let them down."

The **Soccer** team finished runner-up in the Catholic League A-B Division. Charlie Beach '88, John Hayes '89, and Joel Stempien '88 were named All-Catholic.

The Cross-Country team won its 3rd consecutive Catholic League title and its 9th in the last 12 years. Mike Burry '88, was named CATHOLIC LEAGUE CHAMPION, and John Koppin '88 finished second. Also making All-Catholic were Mike O'Brien '89, Jim Rippy '88, and Matt Brown '88. Rice finished 3rd in the state meet on Saturday, November 7, at

the Groesbeck Golf Course in Lansing.

The team also won the Regional at Kimball High School with a total of 54 points. John Koppin placed 2nd, Mike Burry, 3rd, Mike O'Brien, 14th, Jim Rippy, 17th, and Matt Brown 18th.

Our varsity Football team defeated Orchard Lake St. Maru's 41-13 at the Silverdome in the Catholic League Prep Bowl on November 1 to clinch a playoff spot in Region 3 State High School football playoffs. The Warriors defeated Ferndale 28-7 in the quarterfinals on November 14th, to advance to a semi-final rematch against Catholic Central which handed the team its only loss in in the Boys Bowl in double overtime.

The March of Dimes has chosen Albert Fracassa as one of their honorees for its annual Sweetheart Ball set for February 13, 1988. Coach Fracassa will receive the 1988 Humanitarian of the Year Award. We offer our congratulations to a most deserving awardee!

A Historical Perspective

On June 14, 1964, Brother Rice graduated its first class; on May 17, 1987 events came full cycle when Pat ("P.J.") McQueen '87 (son of Pat '64), graduated during the 24th
Commencement ceremontes.
Throughout most of that time period, Brother Rice has had some form of Alumni organization.

For two decades, Br. Joe Grimaldi was a constant factor. Starting as a teacher in 1965 and later as principal until 1986. Brother gave a great deal of his time and support to the araduates of Brother Rice. In the summer of 1965, Brother anticipated the interest of grads in news of each other. A questionnaire was sent out and the results published in the Fall. Along with his busy teaching/activity schedule. Brother was attempting the mammoth task of keeping track of a highly mobile group of graduates. Many of us went on to school or jobs out of state, parents moved, and the war in VietNam scattered Brother Rice around the world.

In 1969, Brother organized a Homecoming dance for Alumni, in the gym. Yes, there was a time when graduates went to Homecoming. If a very hazy memory serves correctly, it was well attended and enjoyed by all. Other than this, alumni reunions were confined primarily to holiday parties such as the annual ones perpetrated by Bob Stark '64 and Dr. Jack O'Hara '64.

The first few years of the '70s saw almost no activity by the Alumni - college,

most of us. In late 1973 and early 1974, Br. Grimaldi persuaded Mr. Jim Murphy to tru and revitalize the Alumni Association. Jim contacted some of the alumni that he saw around, and we were off to a sputtering start. That group had two attributes in great quantity: enthusiasm and ignorance. Somehow, an alumni picnic was held at Boulan Park in Trou. Approximately 300 attended; we had submarines for 500. The earlu Alumni board was composed of Jim Murphy, Ron Kleinstever '64, Ray Malover '65, Rick Pawlowski '68, Jim Wartchow '68, Bill Reisdorf '67, and Denny King 64.

Over the next several years, many activities were attempted with varying degress of success. The summer picnics were continued, a Christmas stag party was held in the cafeteria for several years (remember "body hockey"?) and casino nights were held as an activity/fundraiser. If anyone thinks these ideas were crazy, you should have heard what was turned down. Ray Malover '65 came up with the ultimate raffle idea fortunately/unfortunately, it

of swimming.


-John Birney '76, has taught Honors History for six years. He was recently appointed as the school's first Director of Admissions. John is also the reserve head coach in baseball.



The entire project will be


