

Brother Rice Spectator Code of Conduct

Brother Rice High School, in association with the Michigan High School Athletic Association and The Catholic League promotes interscholastic events and sportsmanship. Sportsmanship is an essential part of any athletic competition and is expected from athletes, coaches, officials, and fans. As a spectator or fan (student or adult) of Brother Rice High School, we expect you to be an example of positive encouragement while supporting our athletes, coaches, and game officials. Our behavior should be positive, respectful, and encouraging of the athletes, coaches, officials, and the game itself.

For students, athletic contests are an extension of the classroom and the school day. All students are subject to the expectations outlined in the Student/Parent Handbook when attending any school activity.

All Brother Rice students MUST present the current year school issued student identification card at the time of admittance to the game. No school ID card, no admittance, no exceptions. Brother Rice respectfully asks that no food or drink be brought into the gym/arena at any time.

During Athletic Contests Brother Rice High School Encourages:

- Enthusiastic and energetic support of your team
- Good sportsmanship
- Family friendly atmosphere
- Commitment to safety
- Welcoming attitude to all fans and visitors

During Athletic Contests Brother Rice High School Will Not Tolerate:

- Disparaging or intimidating comments directed at players, coaches, officials, or others in attendance.
- The use of signage or any display that is disparaging to or intimidating towards players, coaches, officials, or others in attendance.
- Disruptive/unruly behavior or foul language/obscene gestures
- Uncooperative behavior towards gameday personnel or school administration
- Spectators are not allowed on playing surfaces at any time
- Use of alcohol, illegal or recreational drugs, or tobacco
- Activity that is contrary to the mission of Brother Rice High School and the Church

Fans who display unacceptable behaviors will be subjected to sanctions, including refusal of admittance, removal, and other consequences as determined by the school administration.
